INTRODUCTION

To the Inland Revenue Board, Returns Forms are the best tools to determine whether income and expenses and in fact a person's income-earning activities, have been correctly stated. This is possible from the relationship between various items in the return forms which may hide links not readily visible to the taxpayer. The emphasis of this seminar would be what the details required in the return forms actually reflect and how Revenue may utilise them for enforcement purposes.

Apart from this, the seminar will also examine related important issues and avenues to maximise the tax-savings opportunities available. This would include changes made to the Form C.

Further, the Budget 2019 Speech and Finance Act 2018 will be reviewed to explain how the latest amendments like restrictions of any loss brought forward will affect taxpayers. Attention will also be given to the Special Voluntary Declaration Programme.
